The kind of person we're looking for

The youth pastor [YP] will be a Christian and their ministry will be Christlike [incarnational in form, gospel in content]. The YP will be keen to learn and adapt, be committed to good communication and well organised. The YP will understand and apply the St John's vision. The YP will understand team dynamics and be competent in a leadership role. The YP will empower, train and appreciate others.

The YP will have skills and passion in preaching/teaching and pastoral care. The YP will have good computer skills and an interest in following God's Spirit into mission. The YP will be a biblically trained disciple maker, leading a ministry that is relational, trust-worthy, deep & fun.

Discipleship/ Services	 Run a regular service of worship that includes foundations of Christian lifestyle Prayer Praise Preaching/teaching Sacraments [baptism, communion] Form small groups for studying the Bible and current issues Have content that meets various stages of maturity Prepare young people for the next stage in their faith
Be active in the church	 Regularly attending services at St John's or other RDPC churches. Embodying the kind of faith and life they are encouraging in the young people
Lead a team	 Recruit and support volunteers Provide oversight and accountability for volunteers together with St John's elders. Train them in relevant areas Safety Small group leadership Other areas specific to gifts Pastoral care Make an annual budget
Stewardship	 Attend training events annually Read good books [2-3 year based on capacity/preference] or, Listen to podcasts Take regional opportunities when possible QPR, A-OK, PYM Connect, or presbytery events, etc Have regular supervision PYM WOF [for whole team] Record accurately, hours worked on a timesheet to ensure workload is manageable Be up to date with health and safety regulations and ensure they are enacted in all areas Maintain professional boundaries around relationships and workload. Be fully vaccinated against Covid-19

Connect with the Church	 Participate with the RDPC [St John's, St David's, Ngakuru and Trinity] church's life Social events and worship services etc. Instigate combined events Invite church members to be part of the youth program when appropriate Go to staff meetings Attend session, and/or send a regular report Reports to and regularly meets with the minister
Connect with the families of the youth	 Regular communication [e.g., email, FB, letters] Invitation to attend events put on especially for families
Connect with community	 Participate in community events Instigate events for the community Serve the community Become familiar with the school counsellors to facilitate good pastoral care
Organise special events with support [PYM, ministers, elders, etc.]	 From overseas mission trips to Christmas services, from Easter camps to overnighters. Be creative, have fun, think big.
Gather good resources	Collect and utilise a set of resources that offer insight and advice to youth and their families [e.g., grief, suicide, divorce]
